What's on the ballot in 2024?



PRESIDENT

Vice President Kamala Harris will face off against former **President Donald Trump**; **President Joe Biden** dropped out of the presidential race July 21, 2024



SENATE

Democrats currently hold a **51-49** majority in the Senate; **23** of the **34** Senate seats up for election are Democrat-held, giving Republicans an opportunity to flip the chamber



HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES

Republicans hold a slim **220-213** majority in the House; The Cook Political Report rates **24** seats as toss-up, giving Democrats an opportunity to flip the chamber



GOVERNOR

11 states will hold gubernatorial elections in 2024, and only **two** sitting governors will seek re-election



STATE LEGISLATURE

85 of the **99** state legislative chambers in the US will hold elections in 2024, with Republicans currently controlling **54.96%** of seats nationally

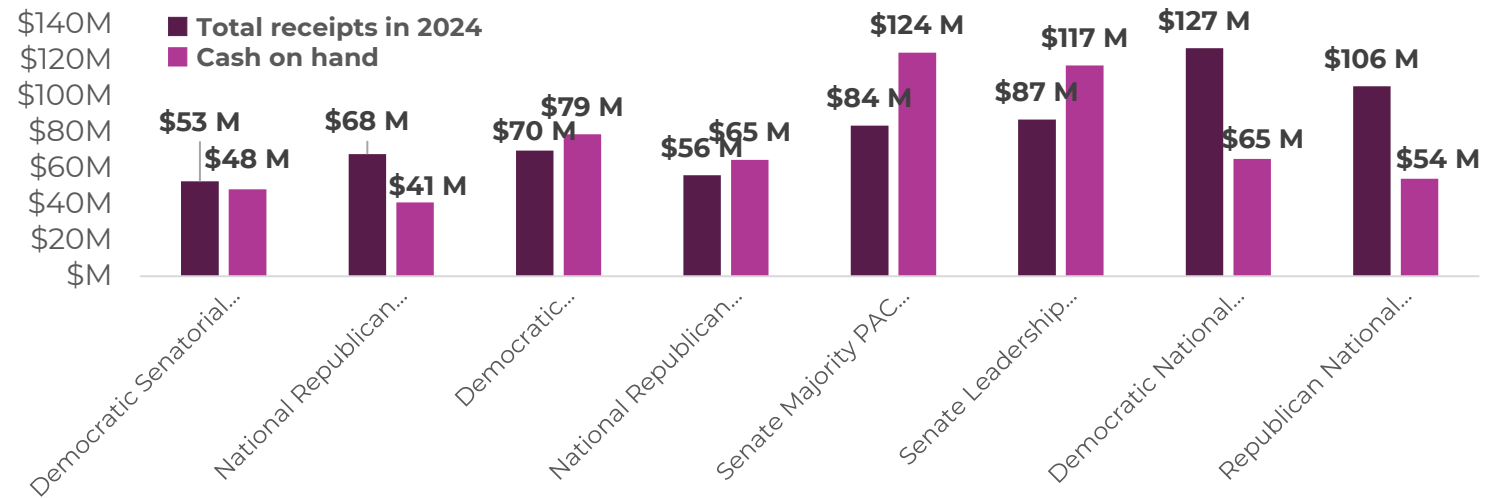
Democratic committees and PACs have more cash on hand than GOP counterparts



House Republican PACs and committees started to gain ground on Democrats' national fundraising advantage in the second quarter. The gains at the national level, however, might not yet have trickled down to individual campaigns, as vulnerable House Democrats and Democratic challengers led their Republican counterparts in fundraising in the second quarter... Ten challengers outraised incumbents in the 20 races most likely to flip in Hotline's House Power Rankings. All of them were Democrats, many of whom are running in competitive seats in New York and California.

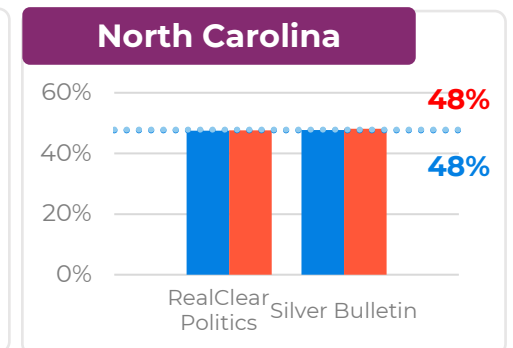
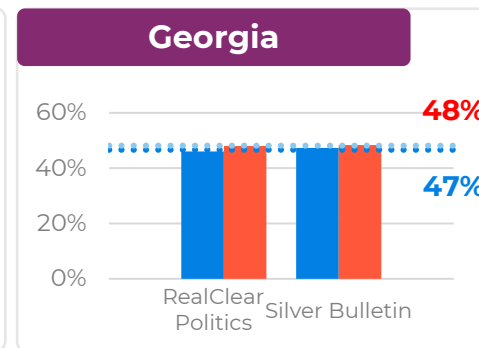
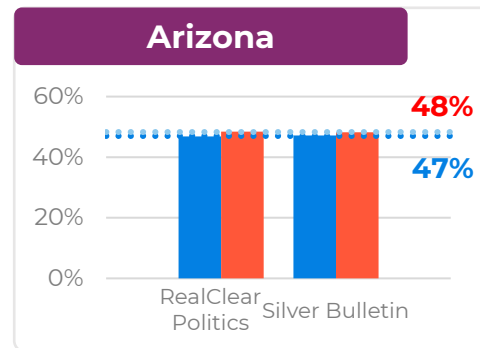
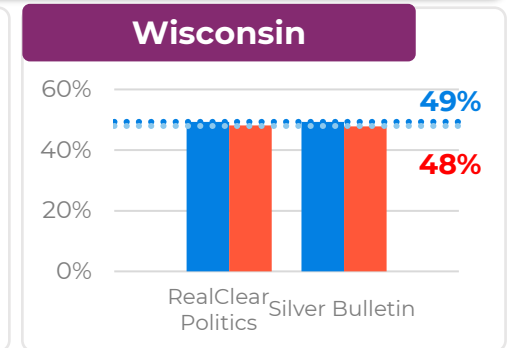
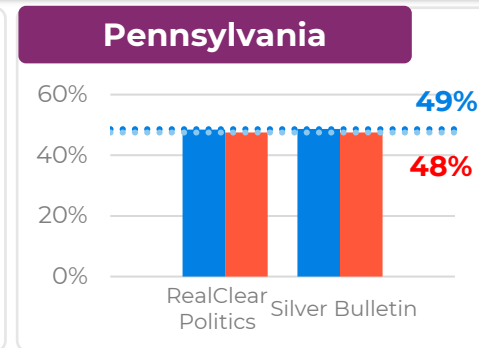
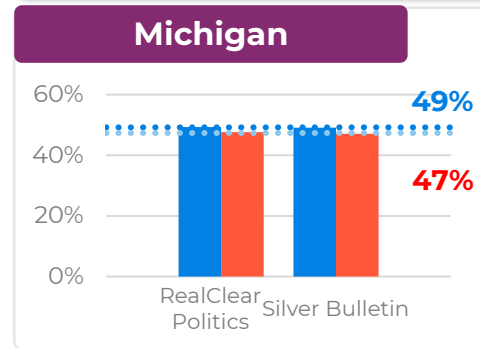
Harris polls ahead in blue wall swing state polls

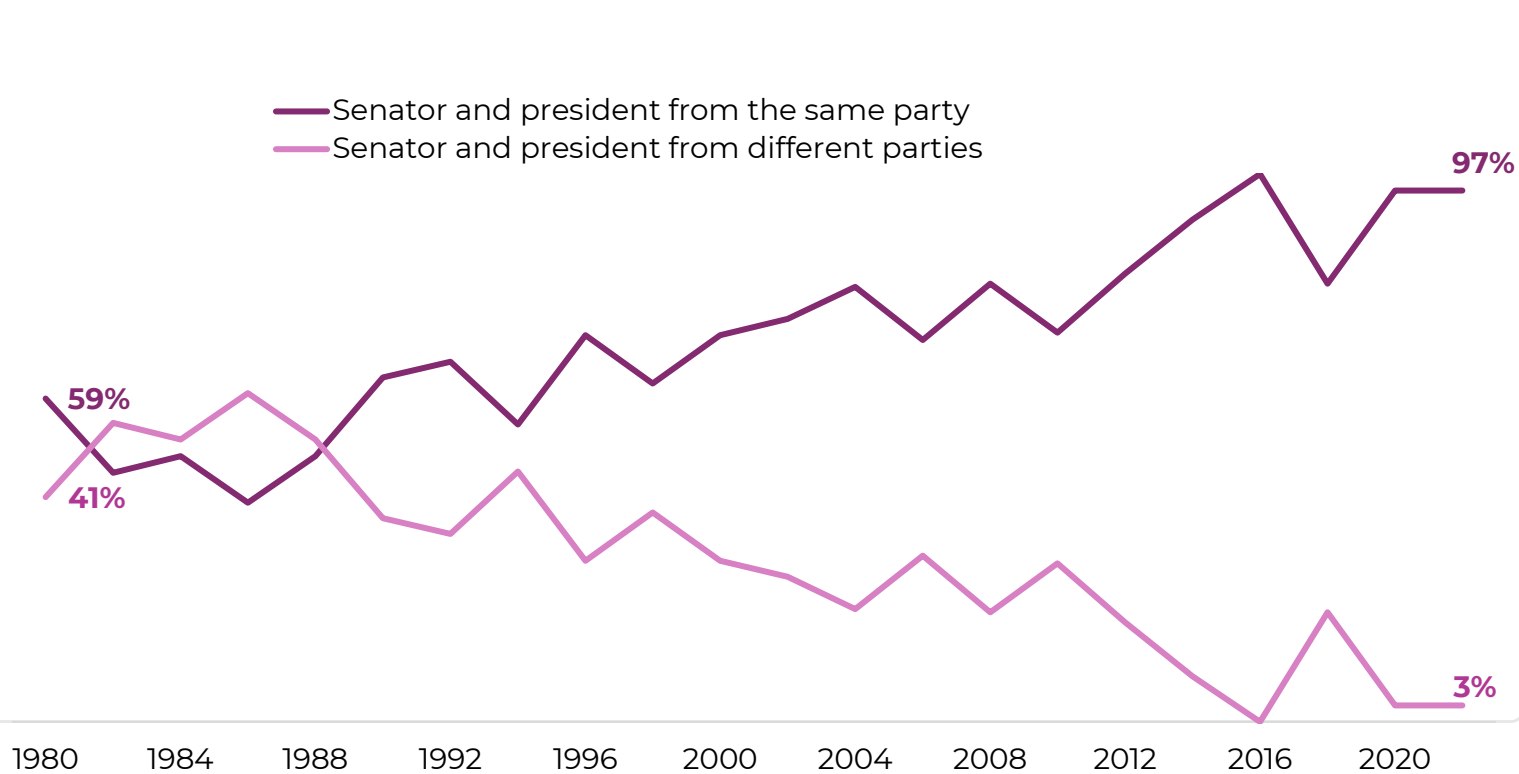

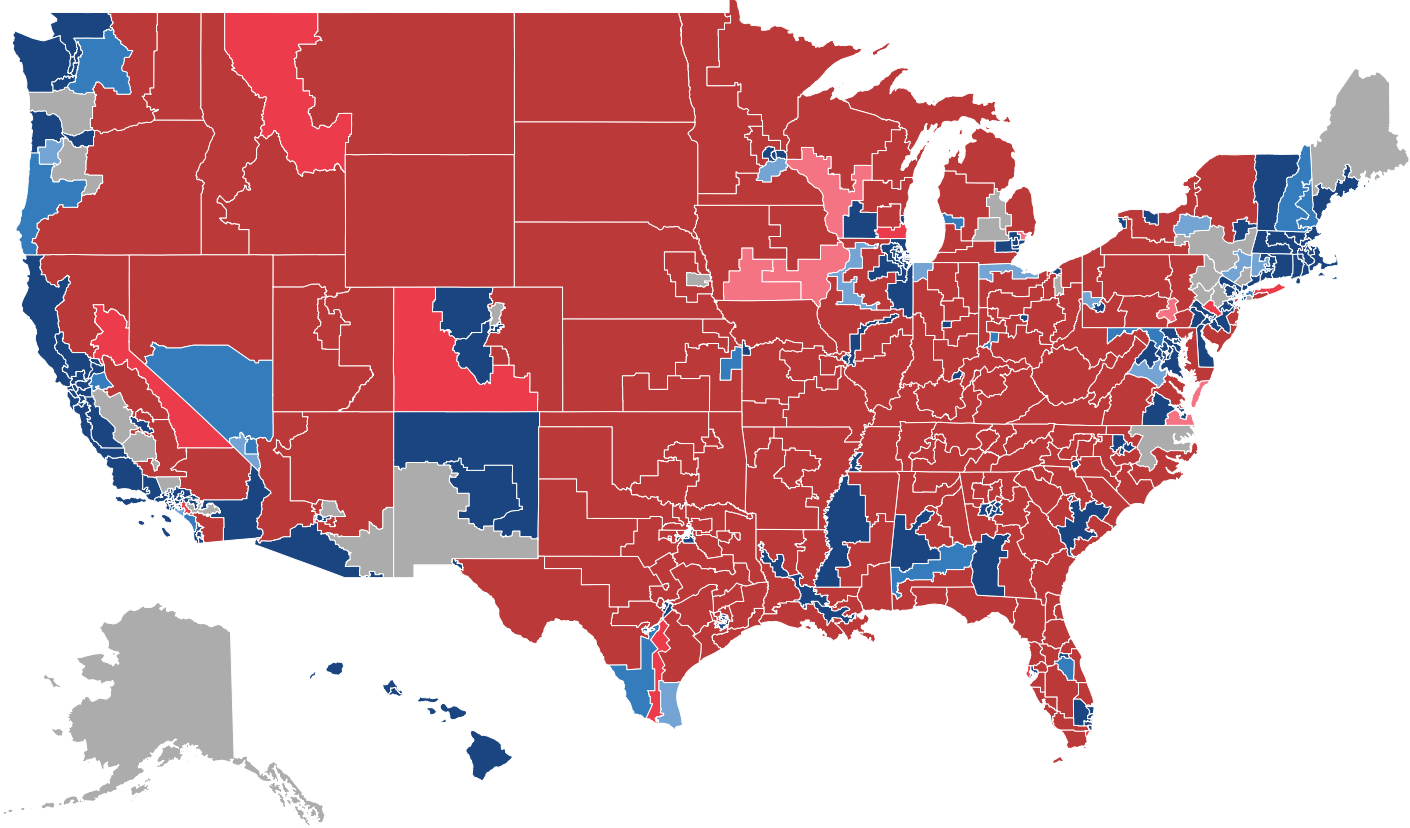

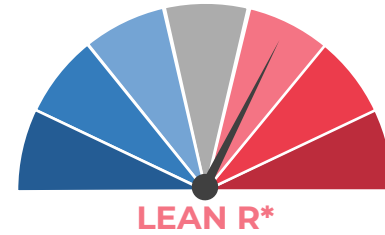
Virginia Senate Election in 2024

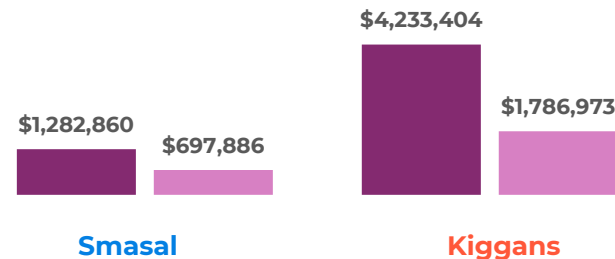

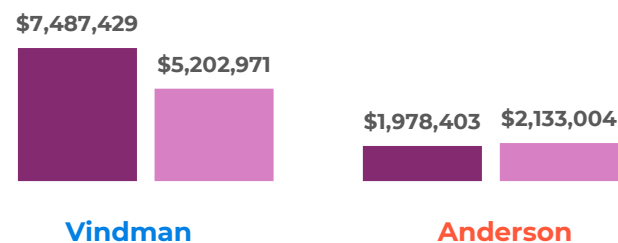

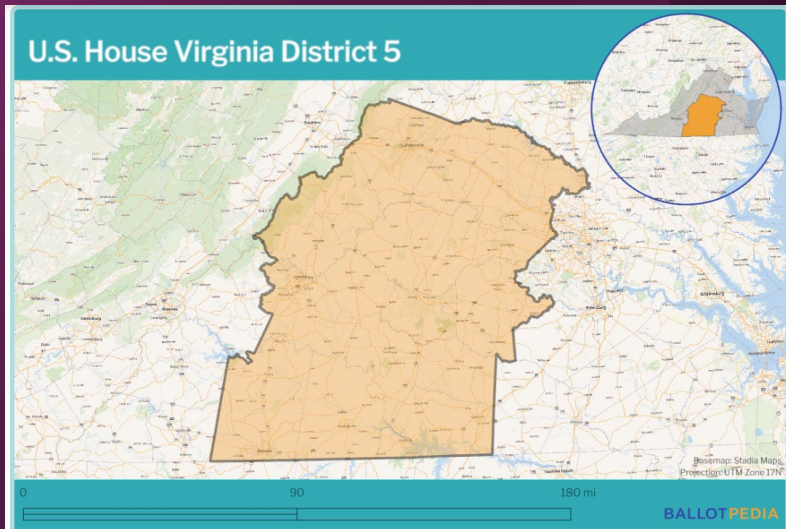

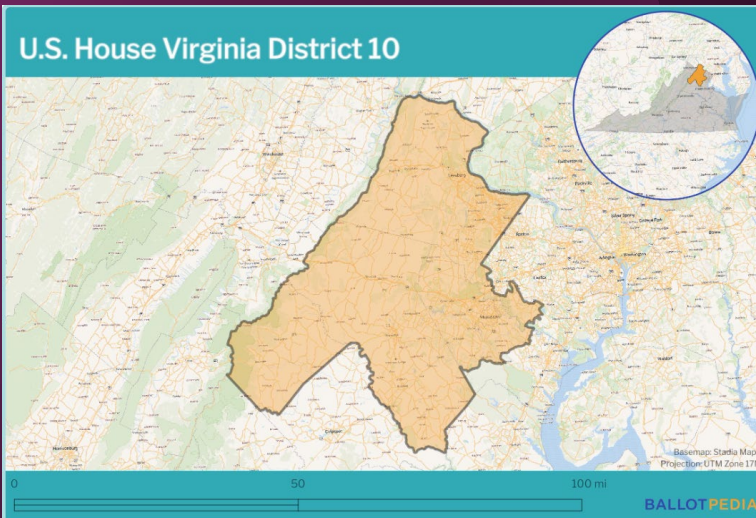
Open Seats

Virginia 5th Congressional District



- The 5th district includes the majority of Southside Virginia. Within the district are the cities of Charlottesville, Danville, and Lynchburg.
- The district will likely be a GOP hold.
- John McGuire defeated incumbent Bob Good in the Republican primary for U.S. House Virginia District 5 on June 18, 2024. McGuire will face Gloria Tinsley Witt (D) in the general election.

Virginia 10th Congressional District



- The district includes all of Rappahannock County, Fauquier County, and Loudoun County, parts of Fairfax County and Prince William County, as well as the independent cities of Manassas and Manassas Park.
- The district closely matches Virginia's voting patterns in statewide races.
- Mike Clancy (R) is facing Suhas Subramanyam (D) in the general election after Jennifer Wexton's (D) retirement.

The top issue for those polled was the economy at 40 percent.



However, housing affordability was second at 12 percent.
